Making heroes out of trainers

Five years ago, Sweden's, at the time, new NSO/NSA initiated a purposeful effort to highlight leadership and its role within the organization. In order to achieve this, a new education system was required that was more modern, accessible, more uniformed and offered what the leaders needed and in a way that suited them.

Now, five years later, we have seen a huge increase in the number of trained scout leaders in Sweden and

the amount of trainers and courses grow by the year.

The focus of this workshop is how this was achieved through extensive work with regional educational structure, more courses, professional and clear manuals for educators, as well as a whole new education system – The Leadership Island. Building a better local group - the Finnish "leader trio" approach

We want that more and more children and young people can be part of scouts, that the groups are strong and active and that the groups receive adequate support. To achieve this, we split the leadership of a local group into three tasks: leader of a local group, leader of program and leader of volunteers and changed the way we support them. In the workshop we tell more about the model and how it has been established in Finland, and help you make your local groups better! A passion for local groups should be a given, but no other expertise or experience is required.

Adapting the EU Data-safety regulation (GDPR) in MO's

In a couple of weeks (May 25) a new EU-legislation for protection of personal data will come into place. This legislation will put more demands on how we handle personal information within and between the European NSO's. Especially when it comes to how we are used to collect, store and share personal information. In short we need to adapt to these new realities in order to stay within the law. The workshop aims to explain the implications of this new legislation, as well as some easy "rules of thumb".
